 Practical solutions and support for the implementation of global citizenship education,


Training in global citizenship education for teachers,



Youth participation

Background

- Lack the information required to make an impact
- Desire to influence and participate in decisionmaking has increased
- motivation and experience of opportunities to influence varies.
- GCE: knowledge, skill values, attitudes, motivation and action
- Encounter and listening
- young people have the right to influence, adults have the responsibility

Global Citizens' Schools -project

- School operating culture:
 - starts primarily from the management
 - GCE glasses on?
 - Influencing cannot be forced
 - Need to find a suitable way

- Top theme given: racism
- Addressed in every situation
- Lessons
- Joint events
- Teacher training
- Students carried out their own projects, e.g a video to social media





- An own course for GCE and Agenda 2030
- GCE themes
- External experts
- Social media campaigns about SDG



"It was great to see how students expanded their range of ideas and perspecives: they clearly pondered more things about others; from the perspective of friends, class, and even our global ecosystem. Some students also woke up to think about how many challenges are globally in connection with each other in many ways." - Teacher



- Student union raised the issue of equality
- School management invited students to participate
- Willing students made a survey
- Students coded a website
- They want everyone to be a part





- Students were given the opportunity to name the school's problem areas
- Willing students were given the opportunity to influence
- Listing: problem, causes, effects, solutions
- Students worked as mediators





- Critical Service learning activities / activism projects
- A volunteer course for anyone interested
- Personal values + sustainable development goals
- Cooperation with local NGOs
- Students can decide: ready made projects or possibilities to create something their own








Youth group

- "Youth" is not a one group of people
- Young vocational school students feel vulnerable to being marginalized in decisionmaking, as politics appears to them to be distant.
- For some, a formal school context is not the best arena for influencing
- Different channels and ways
- NGO cooperation!








