What are the barriers to young people's active citizenship in your educational institutions (or more broadly?)

- 1. Throw "a ball" to someone in the circle by saying their name (or just discuss together). Everyone answers the question. After answering, they throw the ball to another person. Make sure that everyone has a chance to tell their opinion. Ask someone in the group to write down all the ideas.
- 2. As you go through the results of the brainstorming together, you will see what kind of themes arise among them. Discuss these themes together and choose one (or more) of them for more thorough processing. Define the problem as clearly as possible. This makes it easier to get into its causes and effects later on.
- 3. Then take your groups tab in Jamboard (each gropu have their own "problem tree").
- 4. Write the name of the problem on the tree trunk.
- 5. Firts think of different causes for the problem and write all the causes on separate Jamboard sticky notes. Attach these notes to the tree roots. You can arrange the sheets so that similar causes are close to each other.
- 6. Think about the effects of the problem and write them on other sticky notes. Attach these to the treetop. You can arrange the fruits in the same way you arranged the causes in the roots.
- 7. Finally, write proposals for a solution to other sticky notes. Attach the notes to the tree according to which cause or eff ect they can solve. Usually the best solutions are the ones that solve the cause and not the effect.
- 8. Discuss your findings and how they relate to your work.
- 9. Agree who will present your work after the berak.
- 10. Have a coffee break at some point.
